Dr. Mark Stover - Adult Clinician

Dr. Mark Stover is the Director of Choral Activities at Calvin University where he proudly serves as a part of a dynamic team of faculty, conductors, and artist-teachers. He shares his passion for people and building community through pursuing the highest levels of choral artistry. He came to Grand Rapids in 2024 from Ann Arbor, Michigan where he previously served for six years as the Associate Director of Choirs at the University of Michigan, conducting the University Choir, Michigan Youth Chamber Singers, teaching conducting, and holding the role as music director of the University of Michigan Men's Glee Club. Prior to his time in Ann Arbor, Stover was in Northfield, Minnesota, home of Saint Olaf College, where he served on the music faculty as conductor of the St. Olaf Chapel Choir and Viking Chorus while teaching conducting.

Stover had the privilege of leading choirs and serving on the artistic committee for the annual St. Olaf Christmas Festival, a tradition held for over a century and regarded around the world as one of the great music festivals of the season. Stover led the Chapel Choir, Viking Chorus, and the Festival Mass Choir of over 300 voices in the St. Olaf Christmas Festival presented at Orchestra Hall in Minneapolis at the 2017 National Convention of the American Choral Conductors Association (ACDA)

From 2018 through 2022, he conducted the Together In Hope Choir holding the role as artistic director for the Together In Hope Project. This work led to performances throughout Rome, including opening the 17th Annual International Festival of Sacred Music and Art at the Papal Basilica St. Paul Outside the Walls. In July of 2022, Stover led the Together In Hope Choir and Trondheim Solistene in the world premiere of The Stranger (composed by Kim André Arnesen to raise global awareness about refugees and displaced persons) at the Trondheim International Olavsfest, the largest annual cultural event in Norway. He conducted the U.S. premiere in St. Paul, MN at the Ordway Center for the Performing Arts in October of 2022. Additionally, Stover served for multiple seasons as the artistic director of Magnum Chorum, a premiere community choral ensemble of over 60 voices based in Minneapolis-St. Paul, and regularly guest conducts for festivals, conferences, regional and all-state choral gatherings.

In April 2022, Stover led the Men's Glee Club in the world premiere of Tesfa Wondemagegnehu's To Repair as a part of a full concert performance in Alice Tully Hall at Lincoln Center in New York City. On the heels of the premiere last spring, the Men's Glee Club was invited to present the work and an accompanying lecture at the 2023 American Choral Conductors Association National Conference in Cincinnati, OH. Also of note, in May of 2024, Stover took the Men's Glee Club on a three-week tour through parts of South America, presenting concerts in Brazil, Argentina, and Peru.

Dr. Stover holds degrees from St. Olaf College and Luther Seminary where he studied conducting and choral repertoire under the mentorship of Dr. Anton Armstrong and Dr. Paul Westermeyer and completed his D.M.A. in choral conducting at Michigan State University in 2023, studying under Dr. David Rayl, Dr. Sandra Snow, and Dr. Jonathan Reed.

Dr. Stover is no stranger to Bonclarken Music Conference, having served as the Youth Choir Clinician on two occasions.

Troy Robertson – Youth Choir Clinician

Dr. Troy D. Robertson is Director of Choirs and Department Head of Performing Arts at Tarleton State University in Stephenville, Texas, where he leads the University Singers, Texan Harmony, Texan Riders, Chamber Choir, and Texan Troubadours. At the heart of Dr. Robertson's approach in the classroom, rehearsal, and performance lies a commitment to 'community, excellence, and beauty.' He endeavors to foster an environment where singers thrive both musically and personally, consistently pursue the highest standards of artistic performance, and delight in the transformative power of choral music.

Under his direction, Tarleton ensembles have toured internationally—from the Xi'an China International Choral Festival to England and Japan—and performed on premiere stages such as Carnegie Hall. He also conducts the Cross Timbers Civic Chorale, a community choir that regularly collaborates with Tarleton and the Fort Worth Symphony Orchestra, presenting masterworks including Handel's Messiah, Brahms's Requiem, Bach's Magnificat and Christmas Oratorio, Poulenc's Gloria, Mozart's Requiem, Orff's Carmina Burana, Rutter's Magnificat, Bernstein's Chichester Psalms, and Vivaldi's Gloria.

Dr. Robertson's involvement in church music ministry spans congregations in North and South Carolina, Florida, and Texas, where he has led adult, youth, and handbell choirs and enriched worship through song. He and his family now make their home at First United Church of Stephenville, engaging fully in its community life. He has a longstanding connection to Bonclarken camps, where he began as a Music and Art camp counselor and later served as Youth Choir director in 2019 and 2021, encouraging faith, fellowship, and a love for sacred music.

An accomplished composer, Dr. Robertson's choral works appear in the catalogs of Music Spoke, Santa Barbara, Hinshaw, and Colla Voce. His best-selling "In Meeting We Are Blessed" earned a J.W. Pepper Editor's Choice award and placement in the distributor's Basic Library series. His music has been premiered at high-profile events, including the American Choral Directors Association national convention and the St. Olaf Christmas Festival.

A sought-after clinician and adjudicator, Dr. Robertson has led all-state and honor choirs across the country. A proponent of holistic musicianship and well-being, he and his wife, psychologist Dr. Stephanie Robertson, frequently present on work-life balance; they co-authored an article on the subject in the Choral Journal. He is the founder of ChorAmor, a coalition dedicated to providing free resources for choir.

Dr. Robertson previously served on the music education faculty at Ithaca College and taught high school choir in North Carolina, where his ensembles performed regionally and in Carnegie Hall. He was also associate conductor of the Charlotte Oratorio Singers and Charlotte Chamber Singers, preparing them for orchestral collaborations under renowned conductors. His professional training includes a Ph.D. from Florida State University, an M.M. from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, and a B.M.Ed. from Furman University. He is a lifetime member of ACDA and an active member of NCCO, TMEA, and TCDA. Dr. Robertson lives in Stephenville, Texas, with Dr. Stephanie Robertson and their son, Winton.

Victor C. Johnson - Middle School Clinician

Victor C. Johnson, a native of Dallas, Texas, is currently the School Choral Editor for *Sing!*, the educational publishing division of Choristers Guild. A prolific composer and arranger, he has over 450 choral works, vocal solo books, and keyboard collections currently in print.

Since August 2007, Victor has served as the Minister of Worship and Arts at Shiloh Baptist Church, Plano, Texas where he oversees the vibrant SMBC Music Ministry.

In August 2022, he was appointed as the conductor of the Dallas Symphony Children's Chorus Mixed Ensemble, which is comprised of students in grades 9-12 and is the resident children's choir for the Dallas Symphony Orchestra.

Victor has served as a guest conductor, adjudicator, and clinician for music educators and students throughout the United States. He has conducted numerous All-State and Honor choirs in the US and Canada. His own choirs have performed at the Texas Music Educators Association Convention as well as the American Choral Directors Association- Southwest Division conference.

His professional affiliations include: American Choral Directors Association, American Guild of Organists, Texas Music Educators Association, National Association for Music Education, Texas Choral Directors Association, ASCAP, and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, Inc.

Judy Britts - Junior Choir Clinician

Judy Britts is a music teacher, vocal coach, educator, encourager, and conductor, simply translated to, "I teach children to sing".

As a music performance major at San Jose State University, she studied conducting with Dr. Charlene Archibeque and presented her senior recital in choral conducting with a choir of 60 girls she had worked with the previous summer. Mrs. Britts received her master's degree in education from CSU, Sacramento. During her career, Mrs. Britts has led choirs in very large churches with over 150 in her children's choirs and very small churches with only 6 in a choir, and everything in-between. Her church positions have included conducting children, youth, and adults. She taught at private Christian schools in Santa Rosa and Sacramento and is currently the Founder and Artistic Director of the Northern California Children's Chorus. Mrs. Britts also enjoys the opportunities she is given to conduct the church choir she sings with on occasion.

Mrs. Britts has provided workshops and conducted festivals for the American Choral Director's Association, Choristers Guild, Choral Conductor's Guild, and the American Guild of Organists. As an advocate for children participating and leading in worship, she has served two terms on the Board of Directors for Choristers Guild.

She especially enjoys teaching at summer camps like Mount Hermon Christian Conference Center, Bonclarken Music Week, and Lake Junaluska Music Conference because she gets to know the singers, can talk about the text in depth and what it means to the singers. Several days together allows her to teach vocal skills as well as some music reading skills, even to the youngest of singers. She says, "I am thrilled to be asked to return to Bonclarken this year to work with the junior choir. Oh what fun we will have as we grow in our singing and in our faith through the music we are singing".

Susan Eernisse - Cherub and Primary Choir Clinician

Susan Eernisse is a veteran children's choir director, clinician, curriculum writer and editor. Susan, a native of Anderson, SC, is a graduate of Berry College (GA), B.M and M.Ed, and Anderson University (SC), A.F.A. She completed her Orff levels at Shorter University (Level I) and the University of Kentucky (Levels II and III).

This is Susan's second time as part of the Bonclarken Music Week Faculty. She currently serves as Associate Music Minister at First Baptist Church of Gainesville, Georgia where she directs the Young Musicians Choir and Handchimes (grades 4-5). She also assists with planning and leading the contemporary service at First Baptist and serves as Director of the church's Performing Arts Academy. In addition to her church responsibilities, Susan is the Children's Music Editor for Jubilate Music Group.

Susan has taught music in public and private schools and has directed children's church choirs of all ages for decades. She has taught and directed music camps and children's choir festivals for many years and enjoys writing children's songs, anthems, and teaching materials for children's choirs. In addition to Jubilate Music, her works have been published by Growing in Grace, LifeWay, Choristers Guild, and Hal Leonard. She oftentimes collaborates with her husband and Co-Associate Music Minister, Dr. Glenn Eernisse. She and Glenn are parents to two, grandparents to five, and dog-parents to one!

Andy Jacob - Conference Organist

Andrew Jacob holds an active career as an organist and church musician. He currently serves as the Organist and Co-Director of Music at Augustana Lutheran Church in West St. Paul, MN, a congregation with a long history of excellence in the arts. Andy's greatest joy at the organ comes when leading a worshiping congregation in song. He has led hymn festivals around the country in academic institutions and churches of various denominations and has been invited to coach hymn playing and improvisation techniques at continuing education conferences for organists and church musicians.

In addition to his role at Augustana, Andy is the Music Director for St. Olaf College's (Northfield, MN) internationally syndicated sacred music radio program, *Sing for Joy*. Each week, the 30-minute program airs sacred choral music following the scriptural lessons specified in the Revised Common Lectionary.

A multiple prize recipient, he is the winner of the 2019 Ruth and Paul Manz Scholarship Competition administered by the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago, the 2020 American Guild of Organists' Student Commissioning Project Grant, and the 2021 Richard VanScriver Church Music Scholarship in Organ through Metropolitan Music Ministries in Charlotte, NC.

Andy earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in music from St. Olaf College and a Master of Music degree in organ performance from the University of North Carolina School of the Arts (UNCSA) where he was a Kenan Organ Scholar. His primary teachers have included Dr. Catherine Rodland and James Bobb at St. Olaf and Dr. Timothy Olsen at UNCSA.

General Information

<u>Medical Issues</u>: Should an accident or injury occur that requires a hospital visit, a chaperone or church member from your group is responsible for taking the person to the hospital or urgent care. It is the church's responsibility to obtain medical forms, release forms and any other items pertaining to medical issues or medication during the time of the conference. Be sure to let the Bonclarken Office know.

<u>Chaperones:</u> One non-singing adult chaperone must accompany every ten participants and must accompany young children swimming. All participants (even one or two) are required to have an adult chaperone on the Bonclarken grounds. Chaperones are responsible for checking on all participants at all rehearsals and activities and enforcing Quiet Time.

<u>Children's Church</u>: This activity is for Junior, Primary, and Cherub choir members in the Rec Building. Children's Church will take place each morning during Morning Worship. Cherubs and Primaries will be escorted to crafts, recreation, or rehearsal by Music Conference counselors to the Rec Building, where they will be served a snack before Children's Church. Cherubs should be picked up PROMPTLY AT 10:40 AM in the old gym. Primary Choir members will be escorted to their next rehearsal by the counselors. Junior Choir members will join Children's Church at 10:20 AM after their rehearsal and will be escorted to their next activity by the counselors.

<u>Nibble Nook Devotions</u>: Nibble Nook Devotions are held nightly at 9:45 PM for Middle School and Youth Choir members, chaperones, and adults.

<u>Ice Cream, Snacks and soft drinks</u>: These are available for purchase at the Nibble Nook. Hours are: Monday - Thursday from 1:00 - 5:00 PM, 7:45 - 11:00 PM. Friday hours are 1:00 - 5:00, 9:00 - midnight.
